

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
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2022 Statistical Report On the Operations of New York State Public Assistance Programs

Introduction

This report was prepared in fulfillment of the reporting requirements contained in the Welfare Reform Act of 1997, and was compiled by the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) with data developed by OTDA and the Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS).¹ Although the law requires that this reporting should begin upon the yet-to-be-realized completion of the redesign of the Welfare Management System, we continue to report on as many of the requirements that our current data infrastructure allows.

Except where otherwise noted, the time period covered in this report is July 2021 through June 2022 (referred to as the report year). This time period was selected to allow for the compilation of a year's worth of data prior to the end of calendar year issuance date of the report.

For this 2022 report, readers should keep in mind that the report period fell into the COVID-19 pandemic era, and the various effects of that pandemic on society as a whole and government programmatic reactions to it affected many of the statistics reported here. Given the multifaceted nature of these effects, it would be very difficult if not impossible to estimate the impacts the pandemic had on each statistic, so we have made no attempt to do so. Thus, caution should be used when comparing the data here to that in previous or subsequent reports, or assessing the absolute levels of current data, especially data related to participation in work activities.

What follows is a brief summary of current trends in the Public Assistance (PA) caseload for the July 2021 to June 2022 time period and a high-level summary of the data supplied in the main body of the report.²

Recent Public Assistance Recipient Trends




Figure 1: New York State Public Assistance Recipients

Figure 1 illustrates the trend in total PA recipients for the July 2021 to June 2022 period. During this time, the total recipient count increased by 67,310, from 456,630 to 523,940 or 14.7%. This increase reverses the 9.7% decrease observed in the previous report year. Caseloads statewide began to increase in the fall of 2021, ending a downward trend that began after an initial April - June 2020 Covid spike.

Figure 2 shows the recipient count change for the report period for "family" cases as a whole, and for each of this category's components: 1) recipients in the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program (which consists of Family Assistance (FA) and a small number of federally funded Safety Net Assistance (SNA) families where an adult in the case is mandated into drug treatment), and 2) former TANF cases in the SNA program by virtue of exceeding the TANF 60 month time limit or cases that would be TANF except that they are barred from TANF participation due to their alien status. These cases are referred to as SNA Maintenance of Effort (SNA MOE) cases because expenditures on these cases, while not TANF eligible, count toward a state's requirement to maintain a certain level of historical assistance expenditures on families in order to access their TANF block grant funds.³

There was a 32,539 or 11.0% increase in the number of recipients in the family case category, which increased from 295,915 recipients to 328,454. This increase was mostly in the TANF category, on both an absolute and percentage basis.

³ Note that the family recipient counts include persons in non-disabled two-parent cases, even though these cases were moved into the SNA Non-Maintenance of Effort (SNA Non-MOE) case category in October 2006 for the purposes of avoiding the risk of federal penalty for failure to meet extremely high work participation rates for this group. Such cases are distributed between the TANF and SNA MOE lines on Figure 2 based on the classification the case would have been in had they not been shifted.

July 2021 to June 2022





Figure 3 shows the report year trend for the recipient count for "traditional" SNA (Non-MOE) cases, usually referred to as "singles" cases since they consist primarily of one-person adult cases. There was an increase of 34,771 recipients or 21.6%, from 160,715 to 195,486.

Report Summary

This summary, and the report as a whole, is organized by section headings that refer directly by letter to the subsections of the reporting requirements in statute. In some cases, reporting requirements for a particular section overlap with those in other sections. When this occurs, appropriate cross-references will be provided in the body of the report.

Section (a): Applications

Section (a) provides district level and statewide information on the number of case openings and denials, and the reasons for denials, for PA as a whole and for the FA and SNA categories. These numbers are summarized in Table S1.

The main reasons for application denials were failure to comply with application requirements, such as failure to appear for interviews or failure to provide documentation (144,473 or 52.7%), or employment-related requirements (4,015 or 1.5%). Denials related to financial issues (income and resources) totaled 70,277, or 25.6% of denials. There were 6,372 (2.3%) denials due to residence issues. Many denials (49,203 or 17.9%) fell into a miscellaneous "other" category. The denial codes in this category are not directly classifiable into the other categories. Denials in the "other" category include failure to locate the recipient, and cases where PA is denied but emergency assistance is provided.⁴

Section (b): Case Closings and Transfers

Section (b) provides district level and statewide information on the number of case closings, and closing counts by reason for closing, for PA as a whole and for the FA and SNA categories. It also provides district level and statewide information on transfers between the FA and SNA case categories that occurred during the year.

Case closings totaled 233,617 for total PA, 55,586 for FA and 178,031 for SNA. Overall, the most common reasons for PA case closings were failure to comply with program requirements not related to employment (142,476 or 61.0%) such as failure to recertify, and financial issues (45,136 or 19.3%) such as increased earnings or other income. Failure to comply with employment requirements totaled 3,675 or 1.6%. As was the case for denials, a large number of closings fell into the "other" category, mostly situations where the reason for closing was not directly classifiable into the other categories. The "other" category constituted 22,310 or 9.5% of closings. Client requests (8,374 or 3.6%) and residence issues (11,646 or 5.0%) rounded out the closing reasons.

Transfers from SNA to FA totaled 4,031 for the report year. Such transfers can occur for many reasons, including when an adult in an SNA case has a child, a time limited SNA case receives a time limit exemption, or an adult whose cash assistance count causes the case to be time limited leaves the household. Transfers from FA to SNA totaled 16,651. While a portion of these cases

move from FA to SNA due to TANF time limits (an average of 419 TANF cases per month reached the 60-month limit), there are other reasons these transfers occur, such as a child "aging out" of TANF eligibility and creating an adult-only case.

Sections (c), (d) and (e): Subsidized Work Activities, Unsubsidized Work Activities and Training and Educational Activities

Section (c) provides data derived from both sample data and system data on the monthly average number of recipients participating in each subsidized or otherwise sponsored work activity exclusive of training and education activities, and the average number of hours engaged in subsidized activities per week. Also included are systems-derived data on the number of non-exempt and exempt adult recipients, with the non-exempts divided into those that are work limited and those that are not, and the exempts divided into three categories, disability/illness, substance abuse and other (with the other category consisting primarily of caretaker situations). For those in work limited status, the duration of that status is provided. The above data is provided for each of the TANF, SNA MOE and SNA Non-MOE case types. Finally, Section (c) includes district level data on the number of persons receiving child care through the New York State Child Care Block Grant by PA status of the person, and federal and state expenditures on work activities, including Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Employment and Training expenditures.

Section (d) contains data on the number of TANF, SNA MOE and SNA Non-MOE recipients participating in unsubsidized employment and the average number of hours engaged per week, and Section (e) contains data on the number of recipients in training and education activities, and the average number of hours engaged per week.

Data Sources for Work Activities

The data source for work activity counts and hours in the activities varies by case category and region. For the rest of state region (all districts excluding New York City) all information on activities and hours regardless of case category is derived from the Welfare Reporting and Tracking System (WRTS), which receives data from the Welfare to Work Caseload Management System (the rest of state system for administering work programs) and the Welfare Management System (WMS, the State's main eligibility system). For New York City and the State as a whole, TANF and SNA MOE information is derived from the quarterly disaggregated data reports submitted by New York State to the US Department of Health and Human Services for the purposes of reporting and calculating federal work participation rates. These reports contain detailed data on a representative sample of TANF and SNA MOE cases, and are the only source of New York City and thus statewide data on federal work activities. It is important to note that because New York City and statewide activities data are sample-based in the TANF and SNA MOE instances, while activities for non-New York City districts are from systems data, the New York City and rest of state figures in these case categories will not sum to the statewide total. For SNA Non-MOE cases, the New York City data is based on reports submitted by the New York City Human Resources Administration (HRA), and the statewide data is a sum of the WRTSderived data for the rest of state region and the reports submitted by HRA.

Summary of Section (c), (d) and (e) Data

Work Activities

An estimated monthly average of 411 TANF recipients, 416 SNA MOE recipients and 26,940 SNA Non-MOE recipients participated in subsidized or otherwise sponsored work activities (including subsidized public and private sector employment, on the job training, work experience, job search/job readiness training, community service, child care provider for a community service participant, substance abuse treatment and other treatment activities).⁵ The statewide average hours of participation per week in these work activities were 7 and 19 for the TANF and SNA MOE recipients, respectively. The rest of state SNA Non-MOE recipients averaged 15 hours per

week in these work activities (New York City HRA does not report hours in work activities for SNA Non-MOE recipients, as it only reports persons in activities if they meet or exceed the hours required). Also, an estimated monthly average of 11,244 TANF recipients, 8,474 SNA MOE and 5,420 SNA Non-MOE recipients participated in unsubsidized employment, with average weekly hours of 23, 23 and 20 (the latter rest of state only) for each case type respectively. An estimated monthly average of 413 TANF recipients, 237 SNA MOE and 1,220 SNA Non-MOE recipients participated in training or educational activities (including vocational education, job skills training, employment-related education and school attendance). The average number of hours per week participants spent in education and training activities was 15 hours for TANF, 17 hours for SNA MOE cases respectively, and 14 hours for rest of state SNA Non-MOE recipients.

Exemptions and the Work Limited

A monthly average of 10,900 TANF, 8,491 SNA MOE and 89,766 SNA Non-MOE adults were exempt from work activities (this is exclusive of the work limited persons discussed below). This represents 22.5%, 20.3% and 50.8% of the TANF, SNA MOE and SNA Non-MOE populations, respectively. For the TANF and SNA MOE caseloads, most exemptions fell within the illness/disability category and the "other" category, the latter of which consists primarily of persons exempt because they are a caretaker of a disabled family member, with the exemptions more prevalent in the illness/disability category. Relatively few fell into the substance abuse category. For SNA Non-MOE, most (49,956 or 55.7% of the exempt) fell into the "other" category which in the SNA Non-MOE category consists mostly of exemptions due to advanced age and those contesting their employability determination. An additional 5,724 (6.4% of the exempts) fell into the substance abuse category. The remaining 34,086 (38.0%) fell into illness/disability.

In order to assess the amount of time recipients remain in work limited (as opposed to exempt) status, we examined all adults coded as work limited at the end of the report period (June 2022) and looked backwards to see the consecutive number of months they had been in that status. Of the 8,172 adult recipients classified as work limited in that month (836 in TANF 2,305 in SNA MOE and 5,031 in SNA Non-MOE), 20.7% were classified work limited for 0 to 3 months, 20.1% for 4 to 6 months, 34.9% between 7 and 12 months, and the remaining 24.3% for 13 months or more.

Child Care

During the report period, a monthly average of 64,294 children received subsidized child care under the New York State Child Care Block Grant, 20,776 in PA and 43,518 in the low income category. These figures do not include child care subsidies that are distributed through several demonstration projects for students at CUNY and SUNY schools and migrant farm workers through the NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets.

Expenditures

Federal, state and local expenditures in support of work activities totaled \$326,380,684 for the October 2020 to September 2021 period (Federal Fiscal Year 2021), including \$77,648,034 in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Employment and Training funds. The Federal Fiscal Year 2021 data is used, as opposed to the report period, to coincide with required expenditure reporting periods.

Section (f): Sanctions

Section (f) provides statewide and district level data on the monthly average number of recipients in sanction status, the type of sanction, the number of recipients that complied, and the average days to compliance in TANF, SNA MOE and SNA Non-MOE cases. The monthly average number of sanctioned persons for the report year was 2,771, which represents about 1.0% of the 270,850 monthly average number of adult recipients for the period. Most (1,123 or 40.5%) of these sanctioned persons had an employment-related sanction. Each month, an average of 184 persons complied with requirements and ended their sanction. The average length of time to compliance for these persons was 368 days. Note that litigation, law changes and the COVID-19

pandemic have had effects on sanction activity, most notably in New York City. Comparisons to previous reports should be made with those changes in mind.

Section (f) also provides district level and statewide data on the number of sanction-related and work activity-related (the two overlap) fair hearings requested, the number of hearings held, and the outcomes of these hearings, for the full report year.⁶ Readers of this section should note that the numbers reported are based on issues addressed, not hearings per se: more than one issue can be addressed at a hearing, and separate issues addressed at the same hearing can have different outcomes.⁷

For the purposes of economy of presentation, Section (f) also contains fair hearings data on work-related issues, since these overlap with sanction-related hearings and follow a similar format. Also included in this section are data on the number and outcomes of administrative disqualification hearings, i.e., hearings initiated by districts.

Due to the large number of tables in the fair hearings section, they will not be summarized here. Readers should note, however, that outcome numbers will not sum exactly to hearing numbers since some issues initiated during the report year may still have been pending at the end of the report year, and issues from the previous year may have been resolved in the current year.

Section (g): Case Closings

All data available to meet the case closings requirements of this section were presented in Sections (b) and (c). We no longer present data on transitional Medicaid receipt because some follow-up data is no longer on WMS (our report source) due to changes to the Medicaid program brought on by the Affordable Care Act and the institution of New York's health care exchange.

Section (h): Substance Abuse Treatment Programs

Section (h) provides the monthly average number of PA persons residing in Congregate Care Level II drug and alcohol treatment facilities during the report period. This information is provided at the district level and by TANF, SNA MOE and SNA Non-MOE case type. For the report year, the monthly average number of persons receiving treatment in these facilities was 3,269, with most (3,200 or 97.9%) in the SNA Non-MOE program.

Section (h) also contains data on the duration of spells in these facilities, for persons entering in the period from July to December 2021. For the 3,106 entrants during this period, 9.3% had a spell of one month or less, 12.0% two months, 12.4% three months, 10.1% four months, 10.9% five months and 45.3% six months or more.

Section (i): Pregnancy Prevention Programs

TANF funding for pregnancy prevention programs was discontinued, so those programs are no longer included in this report. Data for non-TANF pregnancy prevention programs can be obtained from the Department of Health.

⁶ Fair hearings outcomes described in the report are issues affirmed (i.e., the agency's determination is deemed correct), issues reversed (i.e., where the agency's determination is incorrect), issues withdrawn, issues correct when made (i.e., where the agency was correct at the time the decision was made, but changes in circumstances require agency action in favor of the client), issues settled (i.e., where the issues are resolved through the Pre-Hearing Disposition process) and a catch-all "other" category.

In previous reports, fair hearings tables included a breakout by Family Assistance and Safety Net Assistance. Starting with the 2018 report only total PA tables are included, to consolidate report tables with few entries.

Section (j): Disabled and Work Limited Recipients

All data available to meet the requirements of this section were reported in Section (c) above.

Section (k): Food Assistance Program

The Food Assistance Program is no longer an active program.

Section (I): Domestic Violence

Section (I) reports district level and statewide data for the report year on the number of persons indicating a current danger on their domestic violence screening form, the number of persons whose domestic violence assessments showed a credible threat, the number of persons with a waiver from program requirements as a result of domestic violence, and the number of persons with new waivers granted during the year. Also reported is the number of active waivers broken down by the program requirements that are waived (e.g., time limits, employment, child support, etc.), as well as the average duration of waivers by waiver type.

For the reporting period 6,581 persons checked that there was a current domestic violence danger to them on the screening form. During the same period, 4,867 persons underwent a full domestic violence assessment where a credible threat was confirmed, and 4,778 persons were granted waivers. For the report period 5,726 persons had domestic violence waivers, including persons whose waivers were granted previous to the report year. These persons had a total of 14,528 active waivers during the report year. The number of waivers exceeds the number of persons with waivers because waivers are specific to the requirement for which the waiver is granted, not a blanket exception from all program requirements. That is, a single domestic violence victim can have more than one waiver. For example, if the person is exempted from both child support and work requirements, they will have two waivers. Note also that the number of active waivers for the year, like the number of persons with active waivers, includes those carried over from previous years.

Most domestic violence waivers were granted either from the requirement to cooperate in the establishment of child support (9,241), or from the requirement to participate in employment activities (4,829). Waivers active during the period averaged five months in duration

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⁸ Note that the percentage of domestic violence interviews that result in a credible threat cannot be determined by taking the ratio of interviews that result in a credible threat to the number of persons indicating a current danger. This is because some of the difference between the number indicating a threat and the number where a credible threat was found is due to the client electing not to proceed to the interview stage.

1 Figures for New York State and New York City for TANF and SNA MOE are based on sample data from the Federal TANF and SNA MOE quarterly disaggregated reports submitted to the US Department of Health and Human Services for the period of July 2021 to June 2022. This is the only source for New York City and thus statewide data on TANF and SNA MOE work participation. Data for all other districts is derived from the Welfare Reporting and Tracking System, which contains all necessary data for this purpose (there is insufficient sample size to develop work activity estimates for non-New York City districts from the federal samples). As a result, New York City and rest of state figures will not sum to the statewide total. Recipients may be participating in more than one activity. Subsidized Private Sector Employment for New York City includes Subsidized Public Sector Employment. For sample-based data the Job Readiness Training, Substance Abuse and Other Treatment activities are included in the Job Search category.

Figures for New York City SNA Non-MOE are derived from work participation reports provided by the New York City Human Resources Administration (HRA). The HRA reports do not include hours in activities. All other SNA Non-MOE data is derived from the Welfare Reporting and Tracking System.

Due to rounding in the calculation of averages, the total averages may not equal summation of the individual averages. Dashes signify that the cell is not part of the reporting data set for that activity and region.

SNA Non-MOE activity counts for Subsidized Private Sector Employment, Subsidized Public Sector Employment, On-the-Job Training, Work Experience, Job Search, Job Readiness Training, Community Service, Child Care Provider for Community Service Participant, Substance Abuse Treatment, and Other Treatment may include referred for enrollment, conciliation and referred for noncompliance/sanction counts.

2 Data sources. For rest of state counties, child care payments in the Welfare Reporting and Tracking System database are extracted retrospectively for each month. Low Income Day Care children are those with a case type of 20 (Medical Assistance), 22 (Medical Assistance - SSI), 24 (Medical Assistance - Family Health Plus), 31 (Non-PA Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program), or 40 (Services) and Services Type Suffix R (Low Income Day Care). Public Assistance Day care children are those with a case type of 11 (Family Assistance), 12 (Safety Net FP Non-Cash), 16 (Safety Net FNP Cash), 17 (Safety Net FNP Non-Cash), 19 (Emergency Assistance to Families), 32 (SNAP - Mixed Households), or 40 (Services) and Services Type Suffix S (PA Day Care) or E (Emergency Assistance to Families). For New York City, a monthly data file of all cases with child care authorizations from the Administration for Children's Services (ACS) and the Human Resources Administration (HRA) is forwarded to OCFS. New York City case types are estimated using the designation ACS (low income) or HRA (PA) as provided by New York City. Numbers of children receiving subsidized child care includes subsidies funded under the NYS Child Care Block Grant as well as supplemental child care subsidy funding under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.

A monthly average of 243 additional child care subsidies were also distributed through several demonstration projects for students at CUNY and SUNY schools through NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets. These additional subsidies are not included in Table 17.

Appendix A Welfare Reform Act of 1997 Reporting Provisions

(Section 149 of Part B of Chapter 436 of the Laws of 1997)

- 1. The department of social services or its successor agencies and the department of labor shall collect data related to the operation of public assistance programs including, but not limited to, information that must be submitted to the department of health and human services pursuant to the personal responsibility and work opportunities reconciliation act of 1996 (P.L. 104-193) and any other provision of federal or state law or regulations governing programs administered under title iv-a of the social security act or the social services law. Social services districts shall assist each agency in accumulating such data in accordance with instructions from the appropriate agency.
- 2. Each agency shall make reasonable efforts to collect and maintain the data required pursuant to this subdivision. Data collection shall begin as soon as practicable, but in no case later than upon the completion of the redesign of the welfare management system and the completion of welfare to work caseload management system. The responsible agency shall collect the data related to applicants and recipients of public assistance programs established pursuant to the personal responsibility and work opportunities reconciliation act of 1996 (P.L. 104-193) and the social services law including, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. Data related to applicants seeking public assistance including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of applicants accepted to participate in each program;
 - 2. Number of applicants who are denied public assistance and the reason for denial;
 - 3. Number of applicants who were previous recipients of public assistance on or after December 2, 1997 including length of time previously on assistance; reason for initial termination; length of time between termination and reapplication; and reason for reapplication; and
 - 4. Number of applicants who have resided in the state for fewer than twelve months at the time of application.
 - b. Data related to recipients of public assistance including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of terminated recipients of public assistance and reason for termination; and
 - 2. Number of recipients that move between public assistance programs.
 - c. Data related to work activities subsidized or otherwise sponsored by the department of social services, its successor agencies, the department of labor, or social services districts including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of recipients participating in work activities;
 - 2. Number of recipients receiving an exemption from participating in work activities;
 - 3. The duration of and reasons for such exemptions;
 - 4. Number of participants receiving subsidized child care and the number of exemptions granted due to lack of available child care;
 - 5. The type of work activities;
 - 6. Hours of work per week per recipient:
 - 7. Duration of enrollment in such work activity;
 - 8. Reason for termination from work activity;
 - 9. Number of requests for administrative hearings related to work activity participation including the nature of such requests by general categories and the outcome of such hearings;
 - 10. Number of participants receiving subsidized transportation services;
 - 11. Participant retention in work activities by type of work activity:
 - 12. Length of time before assignment to a work activity;
 - 13. Number of recipients changing work activity assignments and reasons for such changes; and

- 14. Expenditures by social services districts in support of work activities.
- d. Data related to unsubsidized work activities including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of recipients hired;
 - 2. Initial rate of pay by either annual salary or wage basis;
 - 3. Retention rates;
 - 4. Means of obtaining unsubsidized employment including, but not limited to referral by the social services district and direct contact with employer; and
 - 5. Number of participants receiving subsidized child care and/or transportation services.
- e. Data related to recipient training and education activities including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of recipients in training or educational activities by type of activity;
 - 2. Number of recipients mandated to attend training or education activities that fulfill work participation requirements;
 - 3. Length and duration of training or education activity including the number of hours per week and duration;
 - 4. Number of recipients receiving subsidized child care and/or transportation services;
 - 5. Number of recipients transferred to work activities;
 - 6. To the extent available, the number of recipients who obtain work directly from training or education activities including starting salary and employee retention rates; and
 - 7. Expenditures by social services districts in support of training and education activities.
- f. Data related to recipient sanctions including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of sanctions, by type of sanction;
 - 2. Number of sanctions with defined minimum period, by type of sanction;
 - 3. Average length of sanction until recipient compliance, by type of sanction;
 - 4. Amount of sanction, by type of sanction;
 - 5. Period of time starting on or after December 2, 1996 that the participant was in program prior to the sanction:
 - 6. Number and outcome of administrative hearings related to sanctions, by type of sanction; and
 - 7. Number of sanctions against the entire assistance unit.
- g. Data related to case closings including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of case closings;
 - 2. Reason for case closing including, but not limited to, self-termination without reason;
 - 3. Length of time receiving assistance on or after December 2, 1996 before case closing;
 - 4. On an aggregate basis, the length of time recipients do not receive public assistance in New York state following case closing occurring on or after December 2, 1996; and
 - 5. Number of former public assistance recipients receiving subsidized child care and/or transitional medical assistance.
- h. Data related to substance abuse treatment programs including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of recipients receiving substance abuse treatment services for which the cost of such services is paid for by the social services district using public assistance monies;
 - 2. Length of reimbursed recipient participation in treatment program; and
 - 3. Types of substance abuse treatment programs receiving reimbursement from social services districts.
- i. Data related to pregnancy prevention programs funded through federal monies received by the state pursuant to title iv-a of the social security act including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of program participants:
 - 2. Duration of program participation; and

- 3. Types of services provided.
- j. Data related to disabled and work limited recipients of public assistance pursuant to provisions of the welfare reform act of 1997 including, but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of persons applying for public assistance that are screened;
 - 2. Number of current recipients of public assistance screened;
 - 3. Number of persons applying for public assistance that are found to be disabled;
 - 4. Number of current recipients of public assistance found to be disabled;
 - 5. Number of persons applying for public assistance found to be work limited;
 - 6. Number of current recipients of public assistance found to be work limited;
 - 7. Duration of finding by category;
 - 8. Number of changes in work activity exemption status;
 - 9. Number and outcome of administrative hearings related to the disability screening and the determination of work activity exemptions; and
 - 10. Data relating to work and training and education activities pursuant to subsections c, d and e of this section.
- k. Data related to the food assistance program including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of applicants under eighteen years of age by chronological age;
 - 2. Number of applications denied by reason for denial;
 - 3. Number of recipients under eighteen years of age by chronological age and the average amount of food assistance benefits per recipient issued by the social services district;
 - 4. Number of recipients under eighteen years of age by case and by household and the average amount of food assistance benefits issued per case and per household by the social services district:
 - 5. Number of recipients under eighteen years of age in a case and/or in a household where other individuals in the case and/or household are in receipt of federal food stamp benefits and the average amounts of federal and state food stamp benefits issued per case and/or per house hold by social services district;
 - 6. Number of recipients under eighteen years of age in a case or household receiving other public assistance benefits and the average amounts of food assistance benefits issued per recipient and per public assistance case by the social services district;
 - 7. Number of case closings for cases where the recipient is under eighteen years of age by reason for case closing including but not limited to case closing as a result of naturalization;
 - 8. Number of applicants applying for food assistance benefits where the primary reason for potential eligibility is a disability as defined by provisions of this act establishing a food assistance program:
 - 9. Number of applications denied by reason for denial;
 - 10. Number of disabled recipients by chronological age and the average amount of food assistance benefits per recipient issued by the social services district;
 - 11. Number of disabled recipients by case and by household and the average amount of food assistance benefits issued per case and per household by the social services district;
 - 12. Number of disabled recipients in a case and/or in a household where other individuals in the case and/or household are in receipt of federal food stamp benefits and the average amounts of federal and state food stamp benefits issued per case and/or per household by social services district;
 - 13. Number of disabled recipients in a case or household receiving other public assistance benefits and the average amount of food assistance benefits issued per recipient and per public assistance case by the social services district including, but not limited to, receipt of federal and/or state supplemental payment made pursuant to title xvi of the social security act:
 - 14. Number of case closings for cases where the recipient is disabled by reason for termination including but not limited to case closing as a result of naturalization;

- 15. Number of applicants applying for food assistance benefits where the primary reason for potential eligibility is that the applicant is elderly as defined by provisions of this act establishing a food assistance program:
- 16. Number of applications denied by reason for denial;
- 17. Number of elderly recipients by chronological age and the amount of food assistance benefits per recipient issued by the social services district;
- 18. Number of elderly recipients by case and by household and the average amount of food assistance benefits issued per case and per household by the social services district;
- 19. Number of elderly recipients in a case and/or in a household where other individuals in the case and/or household are in receipt of federal food stamp benefits and the average amount of federal and state food stamp benefits issued per case and/or per household by the social services district;
- 20. Number of elderly recipients in a case or household receiving other public assistance benefits and the average amount of food assistance benefits issued per recipient and per public assistance case by the social services district including, but not limited to, receipt of federal and/or state supplemental payment made pursuant to title xvi of the social security act;
- 21. Number of case closings for cases where the recipient is elderly by reason for termination including but not limited to case closing as a result of naturalization; and
- 22. Number and outcome of administrative hearings related to the food assistance program by general category.
- I. Data related to the domestic violence screening process including but not limited to:
 - 1. Number of applicants and recipients screened;
 - 2. Number of positive findings;
 - 3. Number of waivers by category granted as a result of a positive finding; and
 - 4. Duration of such waiver.
- 3. To the extent possible, the data collection activities required by this act shall be designed to collect data in the least expensive and least time consuming manner possible. Scientifically acceptable statistical sampling methods may be used to collect and maintain data on an aggregate basis when authorized by the department of health and human services or when the commissioner of social services or commissioners of its successor agencies determines that collection of such data by any other means is not practicable or would result in significant additional costs. To the extent that statistical sampling is used to collect and maintain data, and unless otherwise required by the department of health and human services, the sample size shall be no larger than the sample size required by the United States department of agriculture for food stamp quality control purposes pursuant to the food stamp act of 1977 and subsequent amendments.
- 4. The commissioner of social services or commissioners of its successor agencies, and the commissioner of labor shall provide reports summarizing data collected pursuant to this act to the temporary president of the senate, the chairperson of the senate finance committee, the speaker of the assembly, and the chairperson of the assembly ways and means committee. The first such report shall be provided to the temporary president of the senate, the chairperson of the senate finance committee, the speaker of the assembly, and the chairperson of the assembly ways and means committee no later than December 2, 1998 and annually thereafter. The commissioner of social services or the commissioners of its successor agencies, in conjunction with the commissioner of health and the commissioner of labor, shall provide the temporary president of the senate, the chairperson of the senate finance committee, the speaker of the assembly, and the chairperson of the assembly ways and means committee with an annual report summarizing data collected pursuant to this act.
- 5. Each agency shall provide the temporary president of the senate, the chairperson of the senate finance committee, the speaker of the assembly, and the chairperson of the assembly ways and means committee with all reports filed with the department of health and human services pursuant to

- the data collection and reporting requirements of the personal responsibility and work opportunities reconciliation act of 1996 (P.L. 104-193).
- 6. The commissioner of social services or the commissioners of its successor agencies, in conjunction with the commissioner of labor, and the commissioner of health shall develop a plan to provide the legislature with the ability to have online access to the welfare management system and the welfare to work caseload management system upon completion of the redesign of the welfare management system and implementation of the welfare to work caseload management system for purposes of obtaining aggregate program data. Such plan shall provide for security measures necessary to ensure the confidentiality of data residing on the welfare management system and the welfare to work caseload management system in conformance with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations. The plan shall be submitted to the temporary president of the senate and the speaker of the assembly no later than February 15, 1998.
