

NYS Solutions to End Homelessness Program (STEHP)

Description:

The New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) announces a combined funding opportunity from the homelessness services programs fund in State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2011-2012 budget and federally allocated Emergency Solutions Grants Program and Temporary Aid to Needy Families funds from the Departments of Housing and Urban Development and Health and Human Services. OTDA will make approximately \$8.3 million available statewide for eligible projects under the Solutions to End Homelessness Program (STEHP). STEHP funding is intended to enhance and support the quality and quantity of facilities and services currently available to address the needs of homeless individuals and families, and those households at risk of homelessness in New York State. The goal of STEHP is to assist individuals and families to remain in or obtain permanent housing, and assist them with services during their experience of homelessness, the eviction process and housing stabilization.

Eligibility/Qualifications - Requirements/Preferences

Proposals will be accepted from local social services districts, units of local government and not-for-profit corporations eligible to do business in the State of New York. Not-for-profit corporations and charitable organizations applying directly to OTDA for funds should provide certification that both the local social service district and Continuum of Care or similar body approve of the project.
