This release replaces 91 INF-4 because the reference to "earned" income in the last sentence of 91 INF-4 should read "unearned" income.

This release notifies local social services districts of the passage of Chapter 233 of the Laws of 1990 which makes permanent the statutory provisions allowing the Department of Labor to grant extended UIB benefits to a claimant attending a training course or program approved by the New York State Department of Labor (NYSDOL).

A UIB claimant attending a training course or program approved by NYSDOL may receive up to 13 weeks of additional UIB benefits following exhaustion of regular and other extended UIB benefits, provided that entitlement to a new benefit claim cannot be established.

The Department of Labor requires that certification of continued satisfactory participation and progress in the training course or program must be submitted to the Department of Labor prior to the payment of these extended UIB benefits.

Local districts should continue to consider these extended benefits a resource available to eliminate or reduce the need for public assistance. UIB benefits received are counted as unearned income in determining a household's monthly food stamp eligibility and benefit level.
