A household that reports a change in its HUD Rent subsidy is not always having its case rebudgeted in accordance with the time frames for acting upon reported changes as defined in \underline{FSSB} VI-B-2-all. Failure to act on such a reported change results in FS underpayments and overpayments.

A change of \$25 or more in a HUD rent subsidy payment is a change that is required to be reported by the household in accordance with FS change reporting requirements defined in \underline{FSSB} VI-B-1.1. The HUD rent subsidy, when paid directly to the landlord is excluded as FS Income (\underline{FSSB} XII-G-2). However, the household's change in out-of-pocket rent expense as a result of receipt of the HUD Rent Subsidy must be budgeted in accordance with the requirements for acting upon reported changes as defined in FSSB VI-B-2-all.
