SUBJECT: FY 92/93 Maximum State Aid Rates (MSAR) for Foster Care

Programs and Approved Private Schools

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of the maximum state aid rates (MSAR) for foster care programs and private schools for the handicapped for the period July 1, 1992 to June 30, 1993. The promulgated rates have been calculated using the approved reimbursement methodology applicable to fiscal year 1992/93.

There will be no 1992/93 cost-of-living adjustments (COIA) to allowable historic program costs reported for FY 90/91. The parameters (standards) used for rate calculation as part of the rate-setting methodology will be based upon aggregate yearly COLA factors and trended through June 30, in order that they remain current.

A. All Rates:

- 1. Approved COLA Increases for Parameters Only Enclosed is a listing (Attachment C) of the approved COLAs for the various subcomponents used to trend the cost center parameters. There is a 0% COLA factor for all personnel services costs for 1992/93.
- 2. Rate Stabilization for New Programs: The Department will continue its rate stabilization policy for all programs for which we are first using their historical program expenditures. We will use a 10% margin of rate variance. No new program rate will be allowed to go up or down by more than 10% from its prior year's rate.

B. Group Care Rates:

The FY 92/93 changes affecting group care programs are as follows:

1. Cost-of-Living Adjustments (COLA)

- a) <u>Personnel Services</u>: The two-year trending COIA for personnel services is 0% for both historical costs and parameters.
- b) Other Than Personnel Services (OTPS): The two-year aggregate COIA for trending other-than-personnel services historical costs is 0%. The two-year aggregate COIA for parameters containing OTPS expenses is 6.4% (3.1% and 3.2%).
- 2. <u>CSE Maintenance Rates</u> The Committee on Special Education (CSE) Maintenance rate for on-campus schools and Special Act School Districts is composed of the 1992/93 institution program's state aid rate plus the 1991/92 medical per diem. The CSE rates will be adjusted automatically when the 1992/93 medical per diem rates are promulgated by the Division of Medical Assistance.

The published CSE rates are 12-month maintenance rates except where noted. As in the past, summer school maintenance costs for children placed by CSEs will be reimbursed by the State Education Department. In those cases, the billing for both maintenance and tuition for summer school will go directly to the placing school districts from the providers. Rates for children placed via the CSE process must be paid as published by the Department.

- 3. <u>Out-of-State Schools</u> All rates promulgated by other states will be limited to the lower of either the Department's approved 1991/92 rate or the state's approved 1992/93 rate.
- 4. <u>Program Classification Reviews</u> Department review of current program classifications will continue. We will focus monitoring efforts on programs which have not been reviewed recently.

C. Foster Boarding Home Rates:

The changes which affect foster boarding home (FBH) programs are as follows:

1. <u>Administrative/Services Rates</u> - The personnel services COIA for FBH staff salaries is 0% for two years for both historic costs and parameters. The two-year aggregate COIA for OTPS is 0% for historic costs and 6.8% (3.2% and 3.4%) for parameters containing OTPS expenses.

- 2. <u>AIDS Per Diem</u> The revenue from the \$15.00 AIDS per diem flat rate has been subtracted from the actual trended FBH program direct care costs. The reduced trended expenditures were then compared with the direct care parameter to determine the rate base. The \$15 AIDS per diem add-on remains in effect.
- 3. <u>Pass-through to Foster Parents</u> The maximum state aid rates for foster parents will remain at 1991/92 levels.
- 4. <u>Clothing Allowance</u> The maximum clothing allowances for 1992/93 will remain at 1991/92 levels.
- 5. <u>Diaper Allowance</u> The maximum diaper allowance for infants from birth through three years will remain at 1991/92 levels.
- 6. Finder's Fee for New Foster Homes The Department is continuing the policy of allowing local social services districts to pay a voluntary finder's fee of up to \$200 to foster parents who recruit new foster parents. The policy will continue in effect through June 30, 1993. For detailed information on how to apply this policy please refer to 88 ADM-54 dated December 23, 1988.

D. Supervised Independent Living Programs (SILP):

The FY 92/93 annual fees for service rates for double and triple occupancy and four-bed mother/child SILPS will remain at 1991/92 levels.

The enclosed chart represents the official promulgation of the maximum state aid rate(s).
