Section 2

I. Purpose

Attached to this release are the responses to questions raised during the series of Time Limit/Tracking Regional Meetings conducted by the Division of Temporary Assistance.

II. Background

Federal and State law establishes limits on the amount of time individuals and families can receive certain categories of Temporary Assistance. Family Assistance and non-cash Safety Net Assistance-Federally Participating families will begin reaching the State sixty-month time limit on December 1, 2001. Districts are examining these cases to determine strategies for self-sufficiency or alternate means of support. OTDA is committed to providing tools and information to assist districts in the examination of these cases. As part of this commitment, DTA conducted a series of regional meetings during the spring of 2001 to provide information for districts to properly review their cases. A series of questions were collected from these meetings and the answers to the questions are provided in attachment C of this release.

III. Program Implications

The Question and Answers attachment C, together with the policy directive 01 ADM-3: "Exemptions to the State Sixty-Month Cash Time Limit/Evaluation for Safety Net Assistance", provide the information necessary for the local districts to correctly determine whether a Family Assistance or non-cash Safety Net Assistance-Federally Participating case qualifies for a State sixty-month time limit exemption.

Further guidance will be provided on how the new Safety Net Assistance call-in and application requirements relate to the face-to-face reassessment interviews discussed during the regional meetings.
