Note: As of August 29, 2012, any reference to the Food Stamp Program in this document shall mean the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and any reference to Food Stamp benefits or Food Stamps (FS) shall mean SNAP benefits.

Section 2

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Information Letter (INF) is to inform social services districts that the "Helping Hands for People in Need" (Pub-4916) is no longer required in all applications for SNAP, formerly known as Food Stamps, benefits, including applications for Temporary Assistance (TA) and/or Medicaid (MA).

II. Background

As established in 07 ADM-09, effective January 1, 2008, OTDA expanded categorical eligibility for most SNAP households, except those disqualified due to an IPV or sanctioned, through the provision of a TANF/MOE-funded service provided in the form of the "Helping Hands for People in Need" (Pub. 4916) brochure to all SNAP applicant and recipient households. The brochure had been provided to all recipients of ongoing SNAP benefits via an annual mailing of the brochure, and to all applicants for SNAP benefits, including applicants for Temporary Assistance (TA) and/or Medicaid (MA), by requiring inclusion of the brochure in application packets.

III. Program Implications

This release is to advise local social services districts that the brochure is **no longer required** to be included in application packets. The client approval notices provided at application and recertification have the *Helping Hands* brochure information incorporated as an addition to the notice text.

Please note that social services districts will continue to have the option to download the brochure from the OTDA intranet and order the brochure from Document Services for local district distribution if so requested.

IV. Forms Ordering Information

- Although there will be no more printings of this brochure, the revised English version of the PUB-4916: "Helping Hands for People in Need Brochure" and the PUB-4916 SP (Spanish) versions remain available for social services districts to order from the state and optionally distribute until supplies run out.
