The United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) recently published its annual update of the HHS poverty guidelines to account for increases in prices over the last calendar year as measured by the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U). The figures on the chart represent 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for a given family size, both by monthly and by annual income. These revised figures are effective June 1, 2014 through May 31, 2015.

The revised chart should be used when determining eligibility for programs funded through the provisions outlined in 00-LCM-20, *TANF Services for Individuals and Families with Incomes up to 200% of the Federal Poverty Level*. Please make sure that both district staff and contracted service providers are made aware of the revised chart.

**200% of Federal Poverty Guidelines Chart**  
**June 1, 2014 through May 31, 2015**

<u>Family Size</u>	<u>Monthly Income</u>	<u>Annual Income</u>
1	\$1,945	\$23,340
2	\$2,622	\$31,460
3	\$3,298	\$39,580
4	\$3,975	\$47,700
5	\$4,652	\$55,820
6	\$5,328	\$63,940
7	\$6,005	\$72,060
8	\$6,682	\$80,180

For family units with more than eight members add \$677 monthly or \$8,120 annually, for each additional family member.

Please note that the above guidelines are applicable to the 48 contiguous states and the District of Columbia.

Also, please note that these 200% of Federal Poverty Level guidelines do **not** go into effect for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) on June 1<sup>st</sup>. Poverty guidelines for SNAP are updated each year on October 1<sup>st</sup>.
