Section 2

Background

The Social Security Administration (SSA) annually evaluates the *Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers* (CPI-W) data to determine if a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) should be made to Retirement, Survivors and Disability Insurance (RSDI) Social Security benefits and federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits to reflect an increase or decrease in the cost of living. Historically, when adjustments are required as a result of the federal COLA, the adjustments take place effective January 1st of each year.

Effective January 1, 2023, RSDI and SSI recipients will receive an 8.7% COLA increase. SSA and SSI benefits will be increased accordingly.

22-INF-08, dated November 8, 2022, announced the COLA increase to SSI benefits.

Purpose

The purpose of this GIS is to inform social services districts (districts) about the effect of the annual Social Security COLA on Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, and, particularly, on the benefits of SNAP recipients participating in the New York State Nutrition Improvement Project (NYSNIP) benefits. As stated in <u>21 TA/DC080</u> and <u>22 TA/DC012</u>, the New York State Combined Application Project (NYSCAP), which uses standard SNAP budgeting methodology to determine participating households' benefit amounts instead of using standardized benefit amounts, replaced NYSNIP effective December 1, 2021. However, NYSNIP and NYSCAP will run concurrently until all existing NYSNIP cases have been converted to NYSCAP. Therefore, the NYSNIP standard benefit amounts will continue to be updated until NYSNIP is completely phased out.

Program Implications

As part of the 2023 January COLA mass re-budgeting/authorization (MRB/A), in response to the 8.7% increase in RSDI and SSI benefits, SNAP benefit levels for affected SNAP households will be adjusted effective January 1, 2023.

Upstate Districts

Information regarding the WMS MRB/A of Temporary Assistance and SNAP benefit levels for Upstate WMS was provided in <u>ABEL Transmittal 22-5</u>, dated November 3, 2022. Affected households will receive a CNS notice informing them of any change in benefit amount.

New York City

Information regarding the WMS MRB/A of Temporary Assistance and SNAP benefit levels for New York City WMS will be provided in a separate WLM. Information regarding the SSI COLA and details on its effect on SNAP and SNAP case processing will also be provided to New York City Department of Social Services/Human Resources Administration (HRA) workers in an HRA Policy Directive. Samples of notice letters sent to affected households will be attached to these HRA directives. The new NYSNIP SNAP benefit amounts (see table below) are effective for any NYSNIP SNAP Shelter Type budgets with a FROM Date of January 1, 2023 or later.

\$300 New NYSNIP "High" Shelter Cost Threshold

Effective January 1, 2023, NYSNIP households with cases opened or recertified prior to December 1, 2021, and having shelter costs **greater than \$300**, will be "High Shelter" (Shelter Type 94 or 96) cases determined by the standard of the project. Conversely, effective January 1, 2023, NYSNIP households with cases opened or recertified prior to December 1, 2021, and having shelter costs of **\$300 or less**, will be "Low Shelter" (Shelter Type 95 or 97) cases determined by the standard of the project. This change to the shelter threshold was migrated on November 13, 2022 for budgets having a **FROM Date** of January 1, 2023 or later.
