- Warmer weather lasts from late May to mid-September, with an average daily high temperature above 70°F. The hottest month is July, with an average 80°F and low of 63°F.
- Colder weather lasts from December to mid-March, with an average daily high temperature below 41°F. The coldest month is January, with an average low of 20°F and high of 32°F.
- The highest average rainfall is in September, with an average of 2.8 inches. The highest average snowfall is in February, with an average of 5.6 inches.
