- Warmer weather lasts from June to mid-September, with an average daily high temperature above 73°F. The hottest month is July, with an average 81°F and low of 68°F.
- Colder weather lasts from December to mid-March 16, with an average daily high temperature below 47°F. The coldest month is January, with an average low of 26°F and high of 40°F.
- The highest average rainfall is in April, with an average of 3.9 inches. The highest average snowfall is in January, with an average of 5.3 inches.
