- Warmer weather lasts from late May to mid-September, with an average daily high temperature above 73°F. The hottest month is July, with an average 82°F and low of 68°F.
- Colder weather lasts from December to mid-March 16, with an average daily high temperature below 45°F. The coldest month is January, with an average low of 22°F and high of 36°F.
- The highest average rainfall is in June, with an average of 3.7 inches. The highest average snowfall is in January, with an average of 9.5 inches.
