

## Proclamation

Whereas, New York State has consistently championed freedom and equality for all of its people; and

**Whereas**, New York has long promoted human rights, welcoming individuals from the world's most vulnerable populations to pursue economic opportunities without fear of exploitation or discrimination; and

**Example 1.000** survivors have been officially identified through New York State's human trafficking victim confirmation process and aggressive prosecutions have been pursued by district attorney's offices throughout the state, those suffering as a result of criminal activity on the part of their traffickers continue to be intimidated due to extreme fear, violence, restriction of movement, and blocked access to services; and

##hereas, New York State has further strengthened its commitment to victims of this heinous crime by providing them with the best services possible through partnerships with skilled service providers; and

**Whereas**, throughout January we will illuminate the subject, encourage discussion and conduct steadfast outreach through all corners of our state to support and serve victims, and embolden our prosecutorial agencies and law enforcement offices to make New York a place where traffickers will not succeed at their practice, circumvent our criminal justice system, or violate basic human rights;
