The purpose of this letter is to transmit the 1995 income standards to be used in determining eligibility for services. State income standards are established using the federal poverty level for family size of 4 as a base, adjusted by family size scale. Local district eligibility levels are recorded in Appendix F of the local district Consolidated Services Plan and are used as input to the district's Title XX services matrix within the Welfare Management System.

The following are the income standards, adjusted by family size scale, which should be used in determining eligibility for services in 1995 and reflected in the 1995 - 99 Consolidated Services.
