Care Program Extension

The Department of Health and Human Services has informed the Department that federal funds will be extended for both the At Risk Low Income Child Care (ARLICC) and Transitional Child Care programs for a three month period. The extension will cover child care subsidies for the period that begins October 1, 1995 and ends December 31, 1995.

Attachment A lists district allocations for the period October 1, 1995 through December 31, 1995. District allocations for the extension period reflect a slight increase over the proration of last year's ARLICC allocation. Remember that the ARLICC funds must be matched by an equivalent amount of State Low Income Day Care funds. For details on the At Risk and State Low Income programs, refer to 95 LCM-93 dated August 15, 1995.

Authority for the Transitional Child Care program also has been extended for the same time period. Funds are available that should allow social services districts to maintain this program at its current level for the period of the extension. There is no specific district allocation for this program.

You will receive an update on the status of these and other federal child care programs as soon as information becomes available.
