TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE

Chapter 83 – Work Activities

[Senate 6358 by Senator Meier, et al.]

Extends from June 30, 2004 until June 30, 2006 the provisions of law that allow certain public assistance recipients to participate in work study and internship programs and have those hours of participation count toward the recipient's work activity.

Effective date: May 18, 2004

Chapter 310 - Standard of Monthly Need, Personal Needs Allowance [Assembly 11104 by the Committee on Rules]

Increases the standards of monthly need for determining eligibility and payment of federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and additional State payments to the aged, blind and disabled to reflect SSI benefit increases that may result from any cost-of-living adjustment occurring between January 1, 2004 and June 30, 2004 and makes corresponding changes to personal allowances provided to residents of congregate care facilities.

Effective date: December 31, 2004

<u>Chapter 380 – Education and Training Opportunities</u> [Senate 7279-A by Senator Meier]

Expands the education and training activities in which safety net participants without dependent children can participate for purposes of complying with public assistance work requirements.

<u>Chapter 714 – Credit of Tax Refunds</u> [Senate 1823-A by Senator Meier, et al.]

Limits recoveries from tax refunds of debts for public assistance overpayments to 10 percent of the taxpayer's total refund if the taxpayer has applied for and is eligible for an earned income tax credit, unless the public assistance debt was incurred as a result of fraud for which a public assistance sanction has been applied.

Chapter 336– Support Magistrates

[Assembly 7511-B by Assembly Member Weinstein, et al., at the request of the Office of Court Administration]

Changes the position of hearing examiners in child support matters to support magistrates.

Establishes requirements for the provision of immigrant assistance services.

Chapter 727 - Application Forms on the Internet

[Senate 1777 by Senator Trunzo]

Requires every State agency and State instrumentality to make the various application forms developed and distributed by the agency or instrumentality for public use available on the internet.
