#### I. Purpose

- □ To inform local districts that the January 1, 2006 cost-of living adjustment (COLA) for RSDI (regular and disability Social Security benefits) and SSI has been set at 4.1%, and
- □ To provide local districts with the SSI Benefit Levels Chart effective January 1, 2006.

### **II. Background**

Every year, the Social Security Administration (SSA) adjusts RSDI (Title II - regular Social Security) and federal SSI (Title XVI - Supplemental Security Income) benefits to reflect the increase in the cost of living. This increase is based on the change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) between the third quarter of the current year and the third quarter of the previous year.

The January 1, 2006 COLA for RSDI and federal SSI benefits has been set at 4.1%. As authorized by Chapter 713 of the Laws of 2005, the full amount of the 2006 federal COLA will be passed along to all recipients of an optional or mandatory SSI State supplement.

The attached *SSI Benefit Levels* chart reflects the 4.1% federal COLA increase and is provided as a resource for informational purposes.

In addition, Chapter 58 of the Laws of 2005 authorized moving Department of Health certified adult homes and enriched housing programs from Congregate Care Level 2 to a newly enhanced Congregate Care Level 3 category.

To address the impact of Chapter 58, GIS 05 TA/DC042 entitled "New Shelter Type '42' for New Congregate Care Level 3" was issued on October 27, 2005. This GIS informed Districts:

- that effective January 1, 2006, adult homes and enriched housing programs certified by the Department of Health will be reclassified from Congregate Care Level 2 to Congregate Care Level 3 facilities, and
- of the systems implications relating to this reclassification of adult homes and enriched housing programs.

The increases in client income of TA and Food Stamp recipients will be addressed by the annual Mass Rebudgeting. See ABEL Transmittal 05-6 for more information about the annual Mass Rebudgeting.

### SSI Benefit Levels Chart effective January 1, 2006 (reflects the 4.1% federal COLA for January 2006)

The Living With Others category includes recipients whose federal benefit has been reduced by the "value of the 1/3 reduction" (VTR) due to the federal determination that they are both: a) living in someone else's household, and b) receiving some amount of free or subsidized food and shelter (room and board).

Applies when an SSI recipient is residing in a medical facility, is not expected to return home within 90 days, and Medicaid is paying for at least 50% of the cost of care.

3 4 Recipients in nursing homes licensed by DOH receive an additional monthly grant of \$25 issued by OTDA called a State Supplemental Personal Needs Allowance (SSPNA). Residents of other medical facilities receive an SSPNA of \$5.

5 This zero State supplement applies: a) when an SSI recipient is residing in a private medical facility and Medicaid is paying for less than 50% of the cost of care, or b) when a recipient resides in certain publicly operated residential facilities serving 16 or fewer residents, or c) while a recipient resides in a public emergency shelter for 6 calendar months during a 9 month period.
