Section 2

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Informational Letter (INF) is to introduce the <u>LDSS-4958</u>: "*TA Sanction and Denial Policy/Participation Rate Impact Guide*" and to apprise local districts that this form is available on-line.

II. Background

The Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 (PRWORA) authorized the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Block Grant program. Under PRWORA, states were granted significant flexibility to design programs to meet families' basic needs and help individuals enter the workforce. In 2005, Congress passed the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005, reauthorizing the TANF program and giving the federal Department of Health and Human Services regulatory authority in certain areas. Largely, New York State sanction policies were not directly impacted but it was determined that there was a need to develop a comprehensive desk guide highlighting the correct usage of sanction "reason codes", the appropriate individual disposition "status codes" to be applied when imposing sanctions for noncompliance with work requirements, and the impact of such sanctions on the participation rate calculation.

III. Program Implications

District staff should begin using the LDSS-4958 immediately. The revised form will enable district staff to properly monitor and report sanctions in a manner consistent with federal and State regulations.
