Safety Net Assistance Project (SNAP) Local District Maximum Funding Levels

Large Districts:

• \$300,000 of the SNAP Funding will be reserved to fund up to 5 proposals in districts listed below whose average caseload is more than double the statewide average.[†]

Erie, Monroe, Nassau, Onondaga, Suffolk and Westchester

• No proposal request may exceed \$100,000.

Medium Districts:

• \$200,000 of the SNAP Funding will be reserved to fund up to 8 proposals in districts listed below whose average caseload is between one half the statewide average and double the statewide average.[†]

Albany, Broome, Chautauqua, Chemung, Clinton, Dutchess, Niagara, Oneida, Orange, Oswego, Rockland, St. Lawrence, Schenectady, Sullivan, Tompkins and Ulster

• No proposal request may exceed \$50,000.

Small Districts:

• \$265,000 of the SNAP Funding will be reserved to fund up to 10 proposals in districts whose average caseload is less than half the statewide average.⁺

Allegany, Cayuga, Cattaraugus, Chenango, Columbia, Cortland, Delaware, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Genesee, Greene, Hamilton, Herkimer, Jefferson, Lewis, Livingston, Madison, Montgomery, Ontario, Orleans, Otsego, Putnam, Rensselaer, Saratoga, Schoharie, Schuyler, Seneca, Steuben, Tioga, Warren, Washington, Wayne, Wyoming, and Yates

• No proposal request may exceed \$35,000.

*Note: Caseload size is based on average monthly SNA Non-MOE exempt and work-limited individuals during the 12-month period from July 2008 to June 2009. Statewide average does not include districts with a population over two million.
