SUBJECT: 200% of Poverty Income Standards Chart - June 1, 2016 through May 31, 2017

The United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) recently published its annual update of the HHS poverty guidelines to account for increases in prices over the last calendar year as measured by the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U). The figures on the chart provided below represent 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for a given family size, both by monthly and by annual income. These revised figures are effective June 1, 2016, through May 31, 2017.

The revised chart should be used when determining eligibility for programs funded through the provisions outlined in 00-LCM-20, "TANF Services for Individuals and Families with Incomes up to 200% of the Federal Poverty Level." Please make sure that both district staff and contracted service providers are made aware of the revised chart on page two.

**200% of Federal Poverty Guidelines Chart
June 1, 2016 through May 31, 2017**

1	\$1,980	\$23,760
2	\$2,670	\$32,040
3	\$3,360	\$40,320
4	\$4,050	\$48,600
5	\$4,740	\$56,880
6	\$5,430	\$65,160
7	\$6,122	\$73,460
8	\$6,815	\$81,780

For family units with more than eight members add \$693 monthly or \$8,320 annually, for each additional family member.

Please note that the above guidelines are applicable to the 48 contiguous states and the District of Columbia.

Also please note that these 200% of Federal Poverty Level guidelines do not go into effect for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP-new name for the Food Stamp program) on June 1st. Poverty guidelines for SNAP are updated each year on October 1st.
