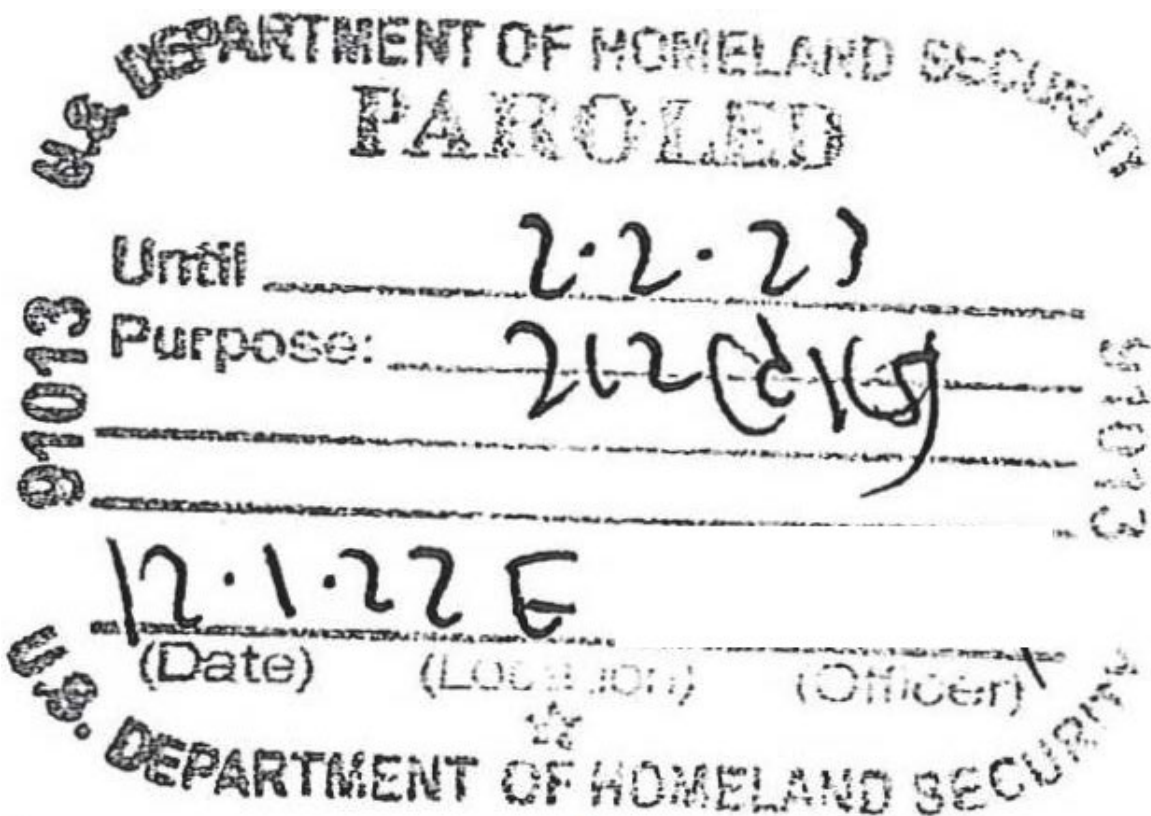


Attachment 1: Examples of Immigration Documentation Indicating Parole for Less Than One Year

Note: These are not the only forms of acceptable immigration documentation to support a non-citizen parole status.
